

Before You Sign on the Dotted Line

Be Aware of Door-to-Door Sales Tactics

As temperatures warm and pests become more active, another phenomena ensues in the spring—door-to-door sales reps.

Some pest control companies use door-to-door sales reps who employ pressure tactics to persuade you to sign a contract on the spot, while others make promises they never intend to keep—all ploys to close the sale. So, who do you trust? How do you ensure the services you pay for are the services you're going to receive?

What to Know Before You Open the Door

If you do choose to open your door, please keep these door-to-door sales tactics at the forefront of your mind:

- **Don't be pressured into an on-the-spot decision.** For some door-to-door sales reps, it's about quantity, not quality. Their main focus is to "close" the sale. They are not responsible for the quality of the customer experience afterward.
- Don't sign a contract that isn't fully explained, or be swayed by discounts applicable "only if you sign now." An abbreviated contract, or one that isn't fully explained, or that applies a discount only if the contract is signed immediately, are red flags.

Recently, one of our residential consultants spoke to an upset customer who had been swayed by promises of low-price service by a door-to-door pest control rep. Instead of solving his mice problem, it was now worse than ever. When the customer tried to return to Batzner and leave the other company, he was told he would be forced to pay a cancellation fee three times the cost of the auarterly service.

"Your neighbors switched to our service, you should too."
 This is a sales tactic that has been repeatedly reported to us by confused customers. The sales rep will present them with a sheet of names and addresses of people in the neighborhood, claiming they switched service providers. Upon following up, they discover their neighbors didn't change providers at all. Give yourself time to check back with your neighbors.

With many of our customers being referred to us by their neighbors, we take these sort of unethical door-to-door sales tactics seriously. Calls from customers letting us know they've received a solicitation have risen dramatically within the past two years. Be wary of signing a contract on the spot. Politely ask for the salesperson's information and let them know you need some time to review the offer, and that you will be checking back with your neighbors. Gutters	Remove leaves, debris, stagnant water
Leaky Pipes	Repair any leaky pipes or faucets
Tires	Drill holes in the bottom of tire swings and wheel barrels to allow water to drain

Buckets	Remove water collecting in buckets and toys
Ponds	Keep swimming pools and ponds adequately treated

Q: It's early spring and I am seeing ants in my basement. How is this possible, shouldn't they still be hibernating?

A: Over winter and early spring, ants enter a dormant state, feeding off carbohydrates and proteins collected during late summer and fall—keeping them content in their nest until spring.

However, despite the cold temperatures in early spring, the warming effects of the sun can prematurely awaken ants from their dormant state, causing them to begin the process of foraging for food sources.

When it's too cold to forage outside, the colony will send scouts to investigate inside. Once a scout locates a food source, they will leave a pheromone trail for more scouts to follow, which is what you are most likely witnessing in your basement.

In order to prevent more ants from making their way in, you can use exclusion techniques, caulking the smallest cracks and crevices can really help.

Securing entry points and removing any potential food sources will also lessen the likelihood of unwanted pests from visiting you in the future.

Online Service Reviews

Take some time to read about other's experiences on review sites like Google, Yelp, and Angie's List. Here are some tips on what to look for when reading a review:

- Check out the reviewer. Do they have a history of writing similar reviews for other companies? They may be paid.
- Be wary of similar wording in reviews. Wording that speaks directly to what the company advertises, or multiple reviews with the same phrasing, are probably not legitimate.
- Read multiple reviews on several sites. A high percentage of good reviews, sprinkled with a few negative ones, usually indicates legitimate reviews. After all, even the best companies will fail sometimes.
- **Read responses.** How do they respond to negative reviews? Do they try to resolve the issue?
- Extremely positive reviews may be paid for. Fakespot.com is a great place to see who some of the offenders are.

Connect with Online Neighborhood Groups

Compare experiences with other homeowners and check references by connecting online with neighborhood groups such as Nextdoor, local associations, city websites and Facebook.
