Food Source	Other insects(dead or alive), honeydew, sugar, grease	Honeydew, dead insects, sweets, spilled liquids	Fruit, honeydew, seeds, insects, meats, bread, and cheese	Sugary foods, honey, grease, spills	Sugary foods
Habitat	Indoors/outdoors, in decaying moist wood, in forests or woods	Nests in fields, yards, along fences, near trees, and by houses	Areas with minimal vegetation, along roads, sidewalks, patios, and driveways	Heated buildings, hospitals, schools, apartments	Near other large colonies of ants, behind woodwork, such as baseboards, windowsills, and under flooring
Other Facts	Tunnels through wood to build nests, leaving behind piles of sawdust Can cause major damage to buildings	Most common ant in Wisconsin	They have a stinger that causes discomfort when stung but are not dangerous	The queen ant can lay up to 400 eggs at once	Steals food from larger groups of ants (how they got their name) One of the smallest ants
	Often main nest is in a tree, satellite nests are found in homes		sometimes referred to as a sugar ant
